"Turtle Mountain School Division faces a fourth consecutive year of budget reductions as the Board finalizes the budget for 2020-2021. Despite continuous growth in student enrolment since 2016, provincial funding for Turtle Mountain School Division has been reduced by an additional \$113,916 for 2020-2021. Even with these ongoing reductions in provincial funding, the Board has made effort once again to reduce divisional costs in order to minimize negative impact on local schools. The Board remains steadfast in its mission to ensure schools receive the resources needed to ensure success for all students. The Board will vote on the 2020-2021 budget on March 4, 2020, and the full budget presentation can be found on the T.M.S.D. website at www.tmsd.mb.ca."

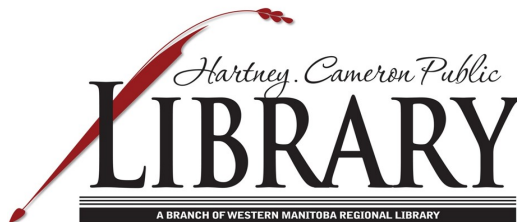



COVID19 SYMPTOMS

Symptoms range from mild (e.g., fever, cough, runny nose and sore throat) to severe (e.g., shortness of breath and breathing difficulties).

While many people will develop only mild symptoms, some groups appear to be more vulnerable to COVID-19. Those at higher risk typically develop more serious, even fatal, symptoms such as pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome and kidney failure. High risk groups include those:

- 60 years of age and older
- living with chronic health conditions (e.g. diabetes, heart, renal or chronic lung conditions)
- with weakened immune systems (e.g. cancer)

Symptoms of COVID-19 or other coronaviruses may take up to 14 days to appear after exposure to the virus.

What's Old at the Museum?

I suggested last month that it would be interesting to look at some of the businesses on the list of businesses that were open in 1904. Today I am going to touch on the McDonald Livery Stable, Duchesneau Blacksmith Shop, Brookbank Blacksmith Shop, Avondale Barber Shop. All of these businesses were in some way affected by the E. Isabey Machine Shop. Edmund Isabey opened his machine shop business in 1899 in the back of Brookbank Blacksmith Shop. In 1902 he built a new brick building on East Railway and began a garage business. In 1904 he expanded the building and put a Pool Room and Bowling Alley. These buildings were located approximately where Terry Mills's garage sits today. Edmund's three sons, Henri Narcisse and Constant worked in the business with him. The buildings were eventually torn down and the bricks recycled.

In 1938 Henri purchased the lot on the corner of East Railway and Ash Street. This was, I believe, the Avondale Barber Shop. It had been sold to Archie Brown who was running it in 1928 when Pete Lougheed came to work for him. Pete eventually bought the business and moved it to the other side of the drug store. Henri built a new garage and service station called Hartney Service Station and Garage. He was an agent for Pontiac, McLaughlin, Buick and GMC trucks. In 1956 the garage burned down. Henri rebuilt on the same lot and his son Tony came to work with him. In 1974 Tony took over the business. The building and garage are still there although no longer operating. In 1939 Connie also left the family business to branch out on his own in Sioux Lookout.

In 1931 Narcisse signed a contract to become a dealer for Ford Motor Co. In 1946 he purchased the building that was on the list a McDonald Livery Stable. The business was owned by the McDonald Bros., Billy and Angus. In 1895 the livery stable along with much of Main Street burned down. The brothers built a new brick building large enough to accommodate 40 horses and with an upstairs office and space for a veterinary office. As things became more mechanized, they converted to a Massey Harris Dealership with P. Draper's shoe shop in the back. After purchasing the business Cec opened Hartney Machine and Motors in its present location. In 1952 Cec's son John joined the firm. John eventually took over the business from his father and worked in it until his death. It is now owned and managed by John's son Larry. Cec's other son Jack joined the business in 1962. With Jack's arrival they purchased the Duchesneau Blacksmith shop on the corner of Ash and Spencer where they erected a new Body shop and service station. Jack retired in 1944 and the body shop closed but the service station is still open.

What's happening at the Museum?

The stair lift project continues with the lift being ordered from Rolling Spokes in Brandon. We are currently awaiting a permit from the fire commissioner's office before they can start to install it. 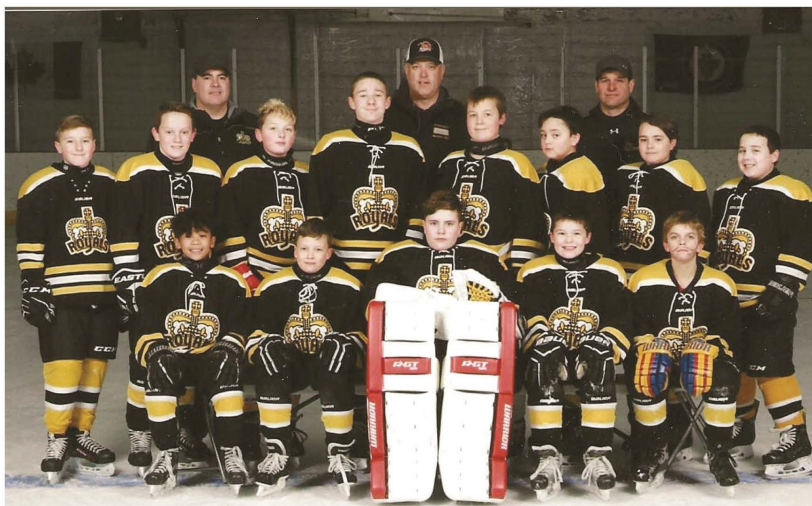

March 2020 Hartney Legion (Branch #26) Report

- ◆ History - The 75th anniversary of the Liberation of Holland - Part 2 (excerpts from CANADA HISTORY magazine) It is a great privilege to liberate a nation from cruel tyranny, and Canada may justly claim credit for freeing the Netherlands in 1945. Canadian troops, along with British and American forces, had been on Dutch territory from the autumn of 1944, but the great cities of Amsterdam, Rotterdam, The Hague and smaller centres like Groningen and Apeldoorn had remained under Nazi control. The Dutch had been deliberately starved during the terrible "hunger winter" of 1944-45, their people brutalized by the Gestapo, while the Allies concentrated on battling Hitler's still-fierce legions in the Rhineland. But by the beginning of April, First Canadian Army turned its attention north, and took Arnhem, Apeldoorn and Groningen, the fighting frequently hard. On April 28, the Germans—fearing that their leaders would be executed as war criminals—agreed to permit food convoys to cross the front lines and bombers to airdrop supplies to the Dutch. On May 5, with Hitler a suicide in his Berlin bunker, the Wehrmacht surrendered to Lieutenant-General Charles Foulkes, commanding I Canadian Corps. For the Dutch, the sight of Canadian columns moving down their roads and Royal Canadian Air Force aircraft overhead was like a gift from God. Food, freedom, and peace at last. Jan Schoofs lives at his farm outside Groesbeek. When he was seven, he awoke to the sound of an airplane engine crashing through the roof of his family's barn. Seconds later, the fuselage of a Halifax bomber smashed into a nearby field, killing its Royal Canadian Air Force and Royal Air Force crew. The airplane had been shot down while on a bombing road over Essen, Germany. To this day, Schoofs maintains a shrine to the fallen airmen in his living room.

The Dutch love Canadians. It is what you hear as you journey through Holland. As you look back to the black-and-white photos of the liberation these pictures depict unbridled joy, a swirling chaos of smiling faces and waving flags, of boys and girls clambering atop Canadian jeeps and tanks, and of young women hugging Canadian soldiers, some of whom would later become their boyfriends and even husbands. Nearly two thousand Dutch women married Canadian soldiers, part of a wave of more than forty-seven thousand European war brides who immigrated to Canada following the war.

Communities across the Netherlands will continue to celebrate the seventy-fifty anniversary of the liberation throughout the spring of 2020. Many cities and towns launched commemoration events last fall, as the county was actually liberated in stages between October 1944 and May 1945.

Canadians travelling to Holland for the festivities will have many options. Apeldoorn will host the Canadian Liberation Festival between May 9 and 10, which will include the Canadian Walk, retracing the steps of the Canadian liberators. The city is also offering two liberation tours, one by bicycle and another by coach.
